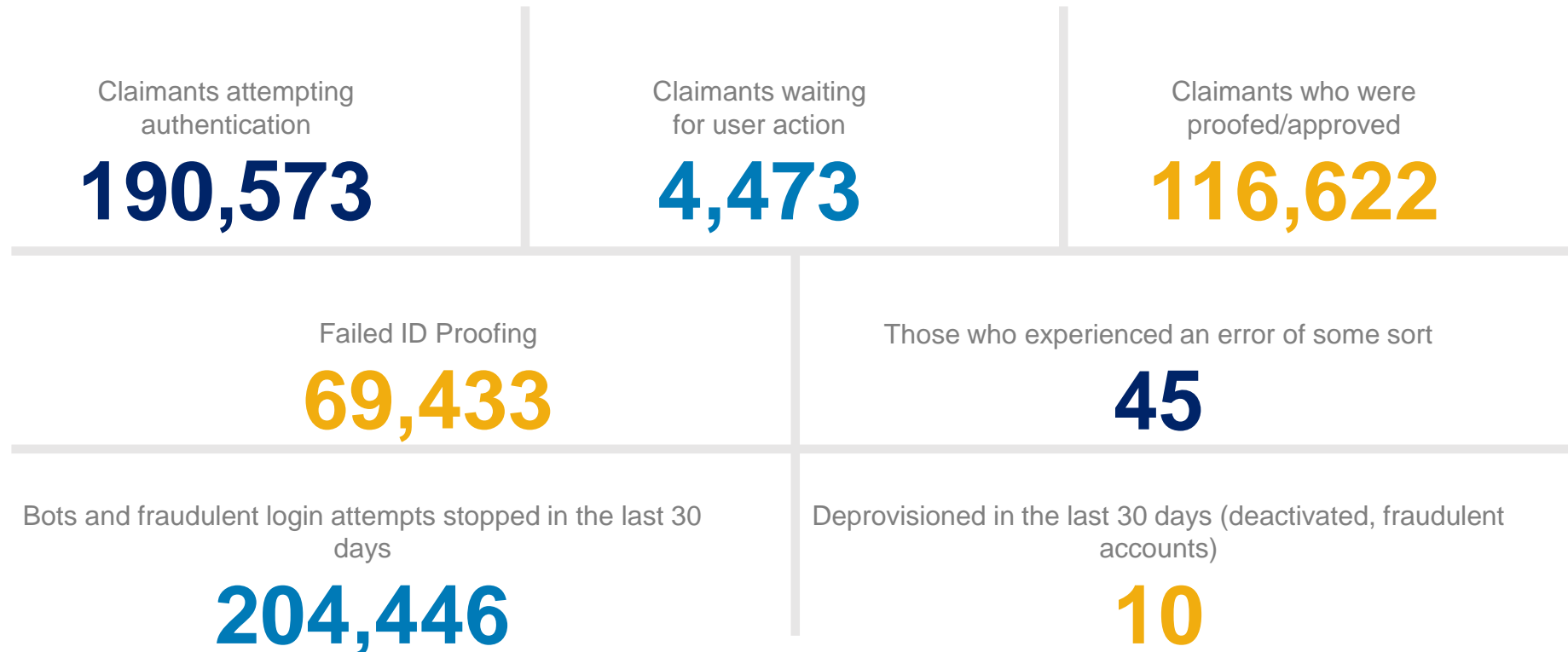

End of Federal Benefits

- All COVID-19 related federal unemployment programs, as originally authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020, and extended through the Continued Assistance to Unemployed Workers Act (Continued Assistance Act) of 2020 and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021, **expired on Sept. 4, 2021, as required by federal law.** For more information, click [here](#).

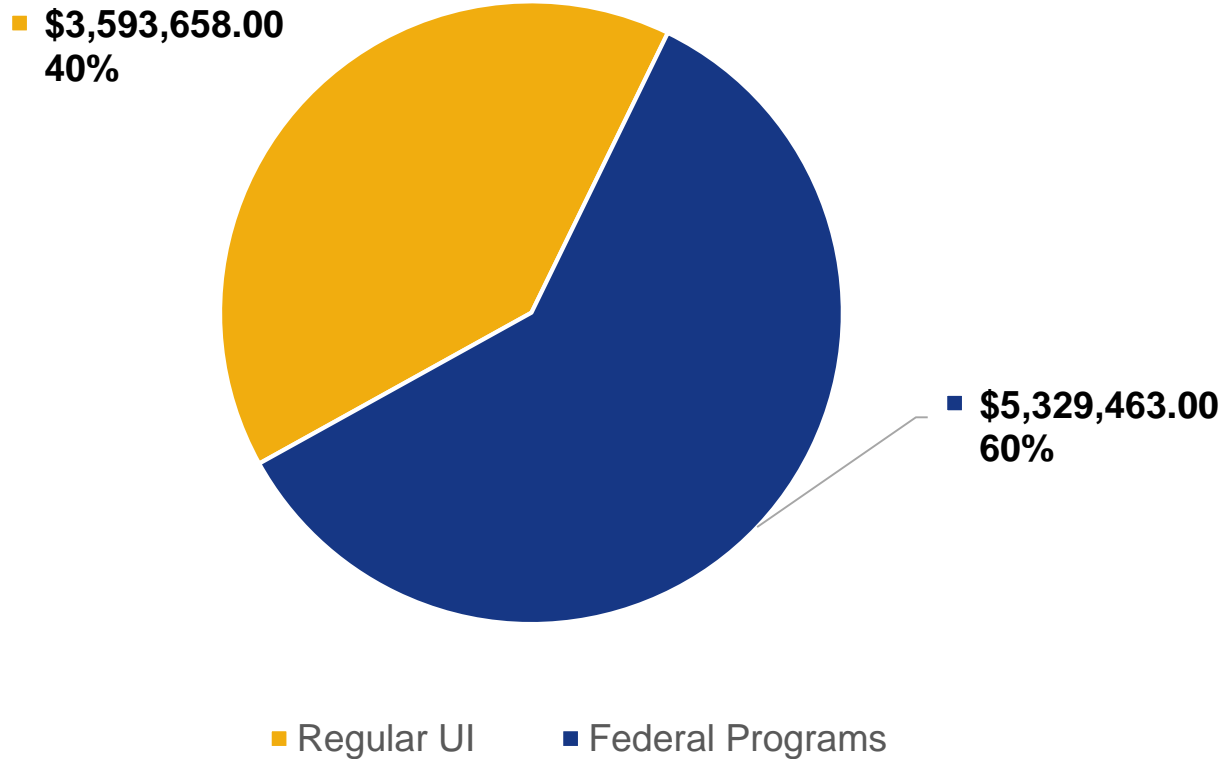

As of the week ending 09/04/21

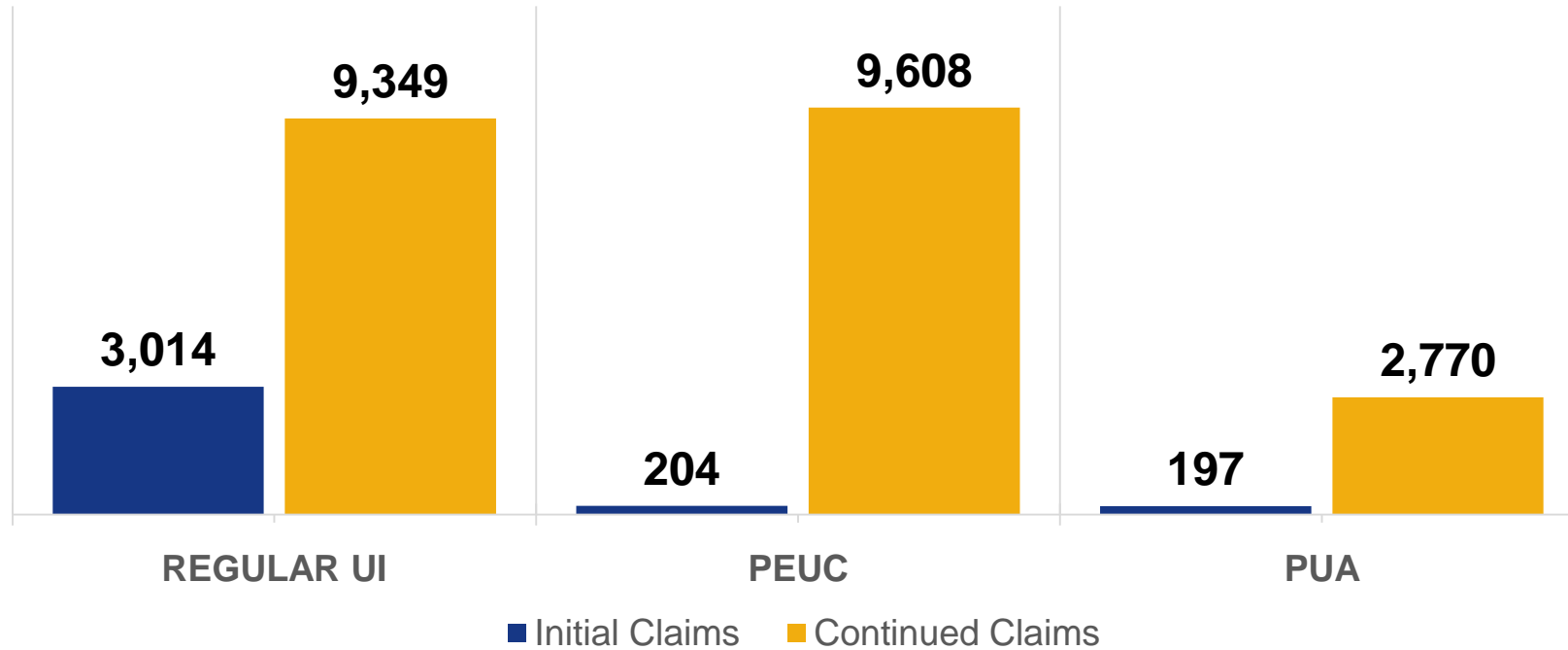


FPUC* \$7,610,944.00

*FPUC is a \$300 payment each week in addition to other unemployment benefits an individual may receive. Claimants who are eligible for at least \$1 of their underlying unemployment compensation benefit amount are eligible for the additional \$300 FPUC benefit payment. If you are eligible, you will automatically receive the FPUC payment. You must file a weekly claim for the underlying unemployment benefit you are currently receiving to qualify for FPUC payments.

Claim Totals

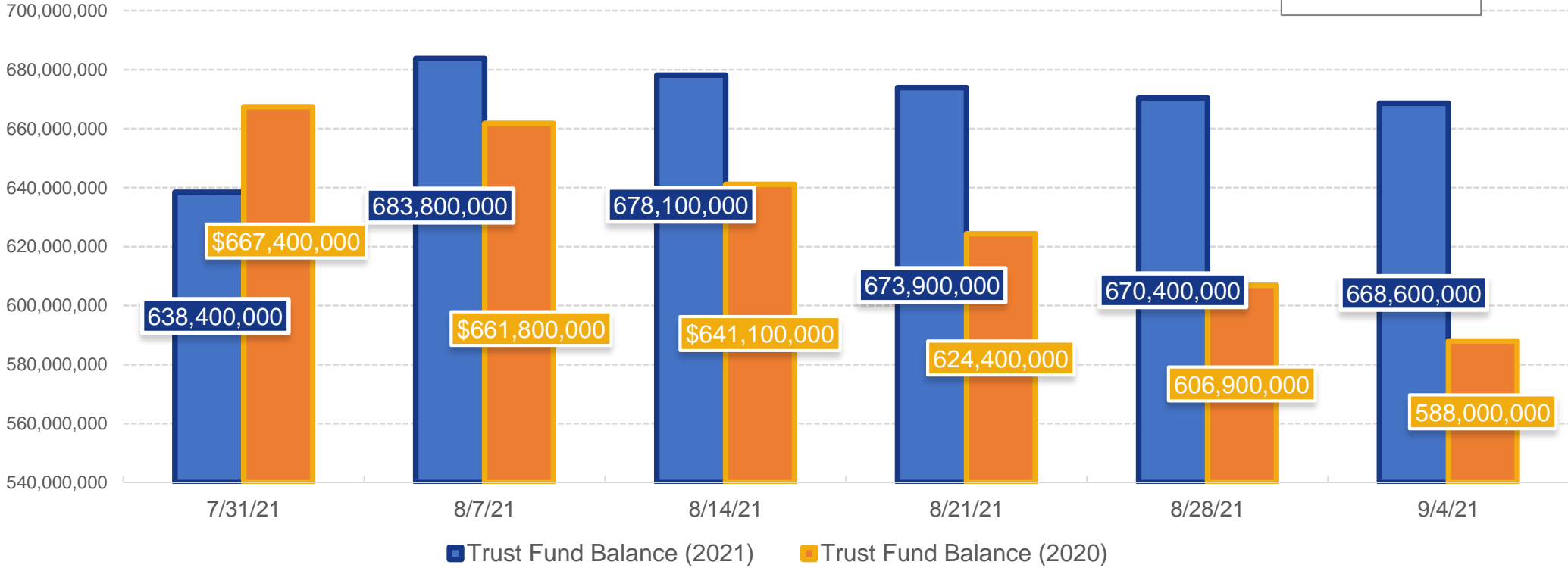
Initial and continued claims as of the week ending 09/04/21

Six week view, year-over-year, ending 09/04/21

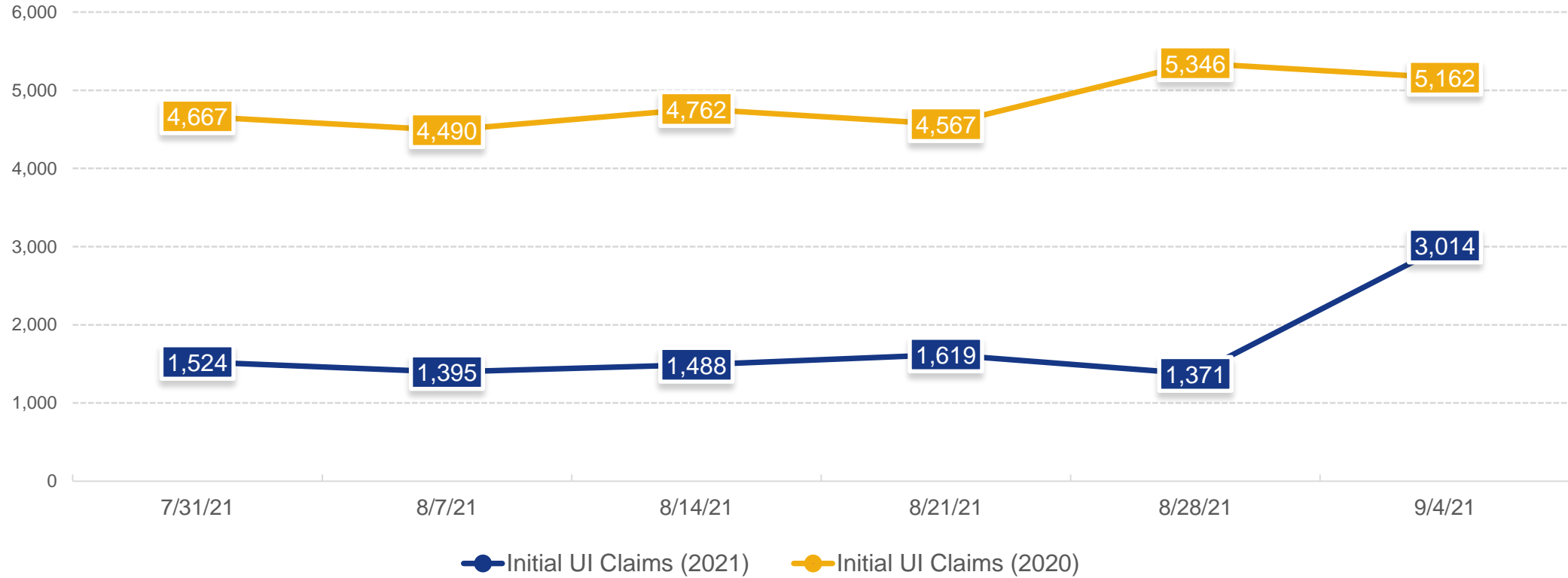

Initial UI Claims

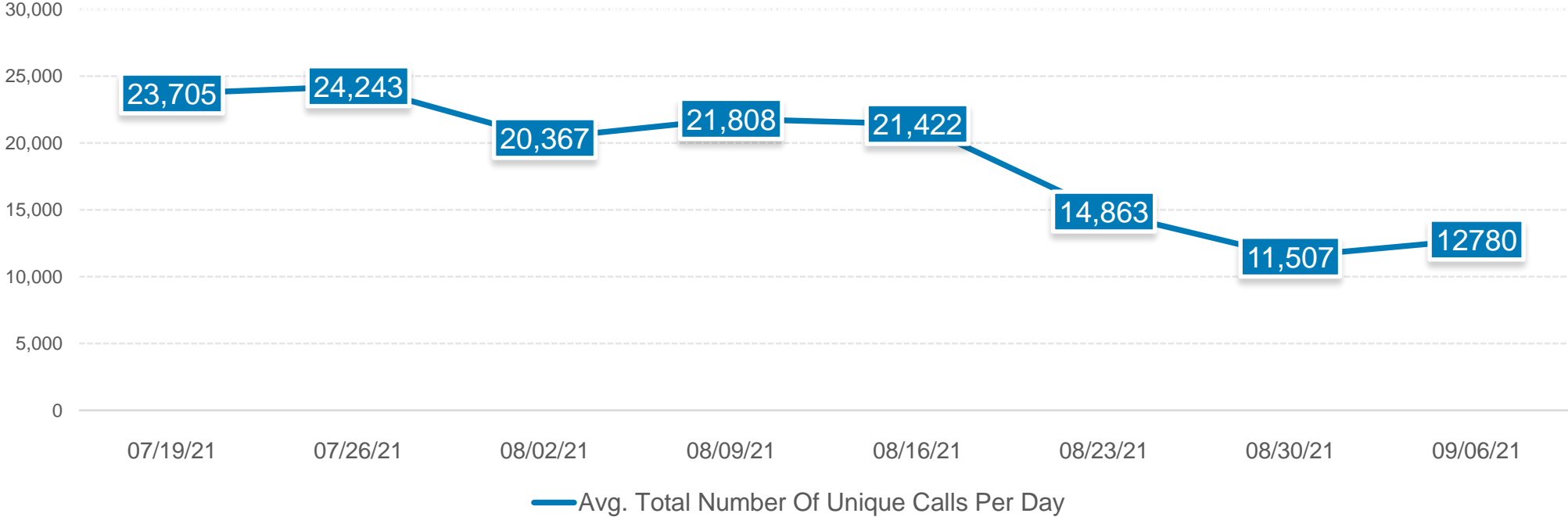
Six week view, year-over-year, ending 09/04/21
